## The President's Column

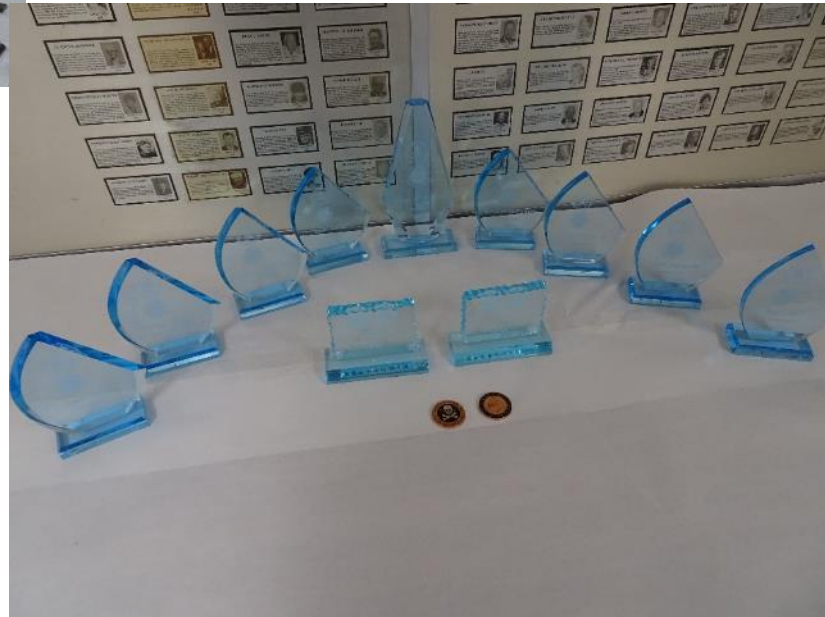

## Vice Presidents Column

### March 2018 Program By Sean Fallesen

This month we will be sharing and discussing the reference materials we use in our modeling. Modeling can, of course, be a simple matter of opening the box and building the model as given to you, as the instructions say to build it, and with the markings provided. But most of us at IPMS Orange County don't do this every time: We paint them differently, or apply different markings; correct errors and add extra detail; maybe even convert the model to a different version that the kit intends. Speaking for myself, I rarely build strictly out-of-the-box, and when I do it's to take a break from my more ambitious projects.

But where do we get these ideas that you can do something different with the kit? Reference materials, of course! Reference materials come in many forms, from the very general (like a basic level "How To" modeling guide that perhaps was your first inspiration to expand your horizon) to the very specific (like a massive collection of every-angle photos of the specific thing you're trying to replicate). Some are visual, some are descriptive. Some are indirect – like a stray quote from a veteran about how oddly the tanks that passed by were painted on one particular day.

Reference materials also vary wildly in quality – grainy pictures are an obvious example, but what of multiple conflicting statements? Incorrect captions? And just how authoritative are those nice 3-D renderings they make nowadays? How much is enough information? How much is too much? How can you tell if the information is dubious? How far do you really have to go to build a contest-winning model? Will the judges know that you didn't buy enough books?

Please consider bringing some references to share with the group. Maybe your favorite model build guide? (or most useless one – that'll be fun to discuss, too) Perhaps a stack of interesting photos from a museum visit where you finally got inside that hatch you'd always wondered about.

The entire crate of books you've amassed over several years for one specific project that you've barely started building... anything that has a good story or lesson attached to it! (I will bring a pile of my own materials as examples for the discussion, but it's always better to have some broader variety and perspective!) *SF*

Eastern region newsletter correspondent Dennis Nowicki checks in from chilly Tokyo with a visit to the Yasukuni Shrine and reports the following:

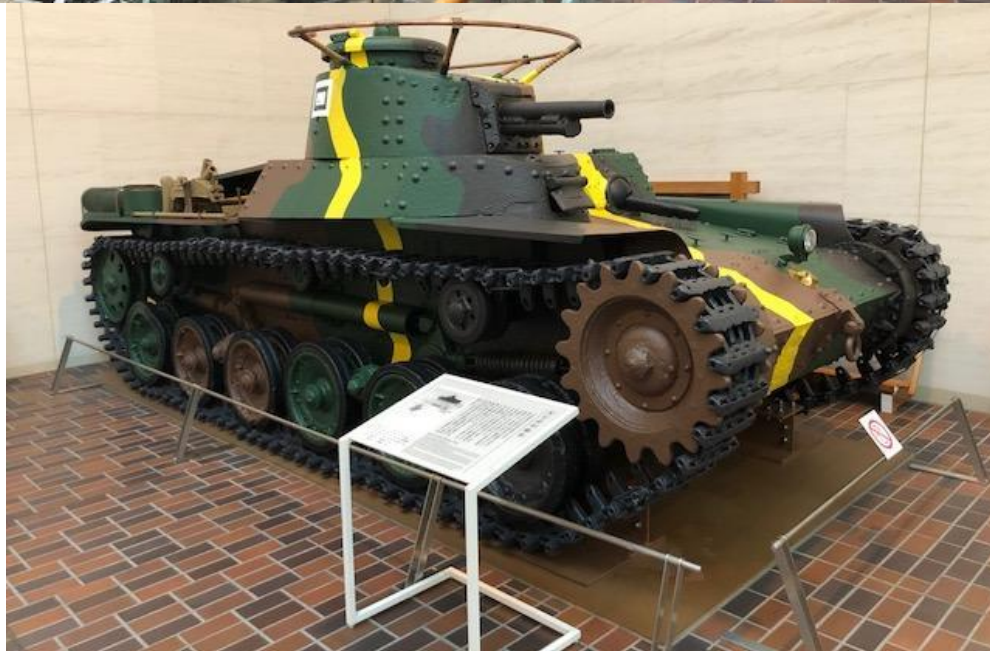

## Valley Con - A Day at the Museum

Valley Con 2018 was held Sunday March 4 at the Peterson Automotive Museum on Wilshire Blvd. in Los Angeles. For those who do not know about it this model show and contest has been an annual event in the LA area for the past 28 years, put on by George Creed and The Pasadena Modelers Society. It has been at the Petersen for the last three. The museum is a world class venue, one of the best automotive museums that I have been to. The main showroom on

the first floor has a rotating display, this year we were treated to an amazing display of Porsche automobiles from all eras in “The Porsche Effect”.

This year’s show featured 508 model entries by 136 different modelers. Over 1,500 people were through the Petersen on this Sunday, and about a quarter of them were modelers. This is a great way to show our hobby off to the public as the artistic craft that it is. Although this is a show open to all genres of models, this year car models took the spotlight. From a spectacular Whittier Blvd. cruise diorama featuring 190 car models to some outstanding models in 1/12 scale that displayed as much detail as the real deal, this show was quite a car model event. The Whittier Blvd. Cruise diorama was built by the group Masterpiece, and coordinated by Armando Flores. Masterpiece is a collection of local car modeler clubs and individuals.

This year also saw the first time that the model train community was part of the event. Three of Southern California train clubs took part in the show, with modular layouts and static displays of the models and buildings. The display was set up in the museum’s fourth floor Rooftop Penthouse. This venue, besides housing the layouts in a very well lit room, gives visitors a great view of the surrounding city. The participating organizations who set up layouts were: The Southern California Traction Club, 20s and 30s and Beyond, and the South Coast ON30 Modular Train Group. It is unbelievable how detailed these models were considering that they have to be portable. Excellent craftsmanship all the way around.

In the vendor model kit industry was represented by several companies and retailers. Tamiya Models, Volks USA (Zoukei-Mura), Mission Models and Monroe Perdue Design Studios all had great displays set up. Also present were retailers Burbank House of Hobbies, Rareplanes Detective and Read All About It Books, as well as several individual sellers. There was also a table set up for NASA – JPL with models of various spacecraft and plenty of free literature.

My wife and I arrived at the show a little before 10:00 AM. I entered my model, then wandered through the tables taking pictures and in general enjoying the models. We also went through the Porsche exhibit. We then went upstairs to check out the train exhibit in the penthouse. Like I mentioned before, great detail on the portable layouts. We walked down the street (The Miracle Mile section of Wilshire) and found a place for lunch. After coming back to the show, I spent more time taking pictures. I saw several Orange County IPMS members at the show, Dave Fredericks, Sean Fallesen, Brian Casteel, Mark Deliduka, Dan Matthews and Julian English. We made our presence known at the show (major congrats to Sean and Brian). The raffle was one of the best Valley Con has had, with over one hundred prizes handed out, from kits to modeling supplies to gift cards.

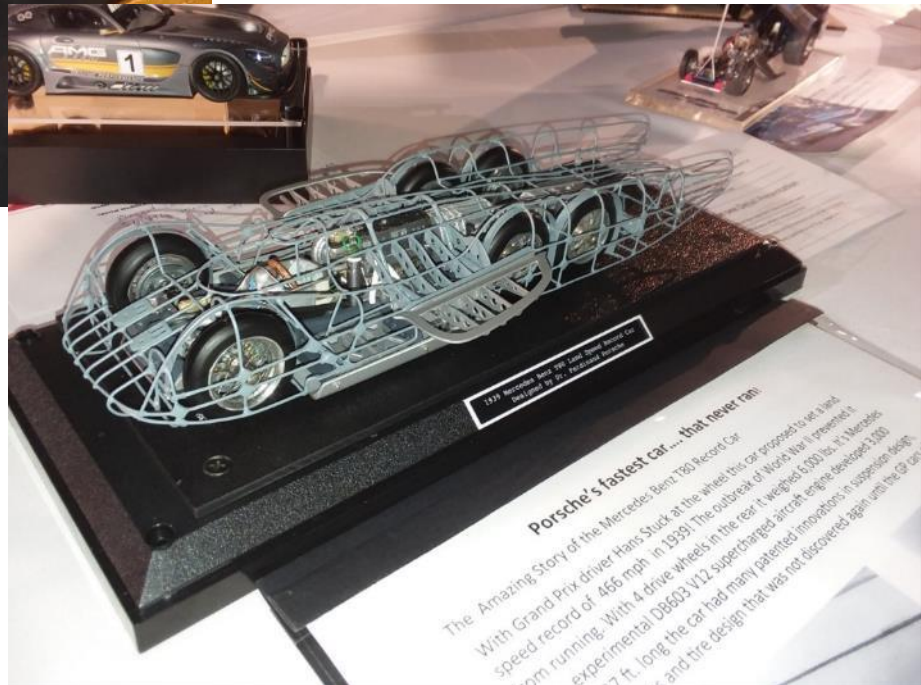

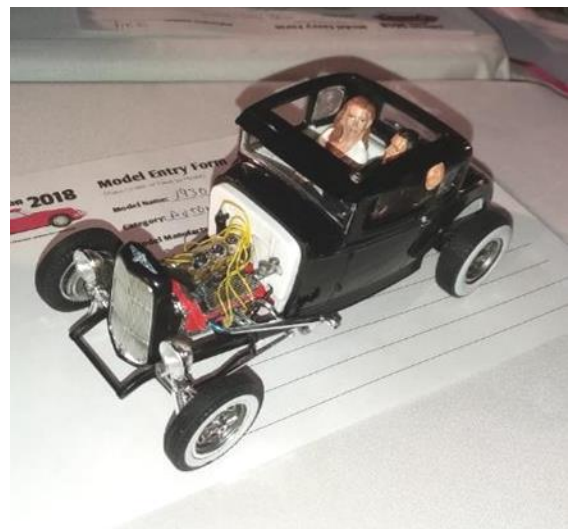

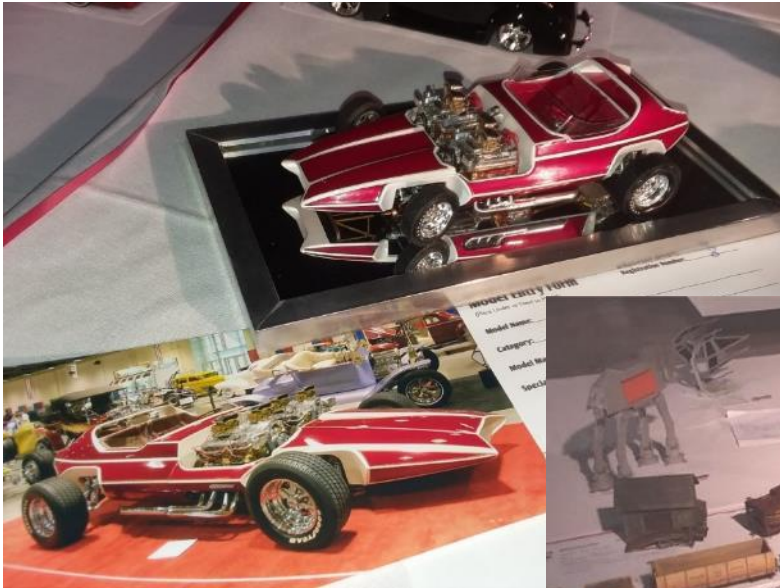

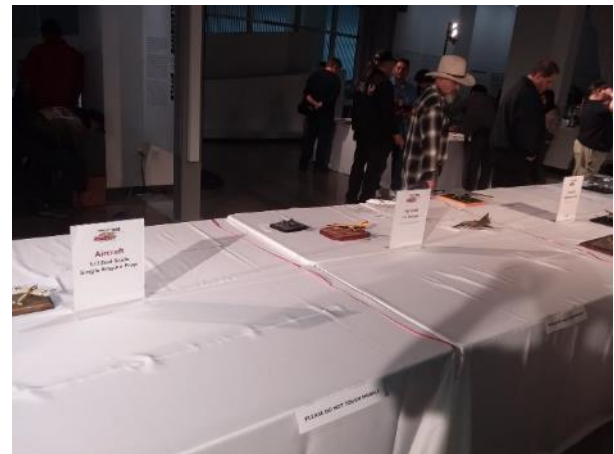

If you find a kit you like, be sure to check at the other tables as sometimes the prices are widely different.





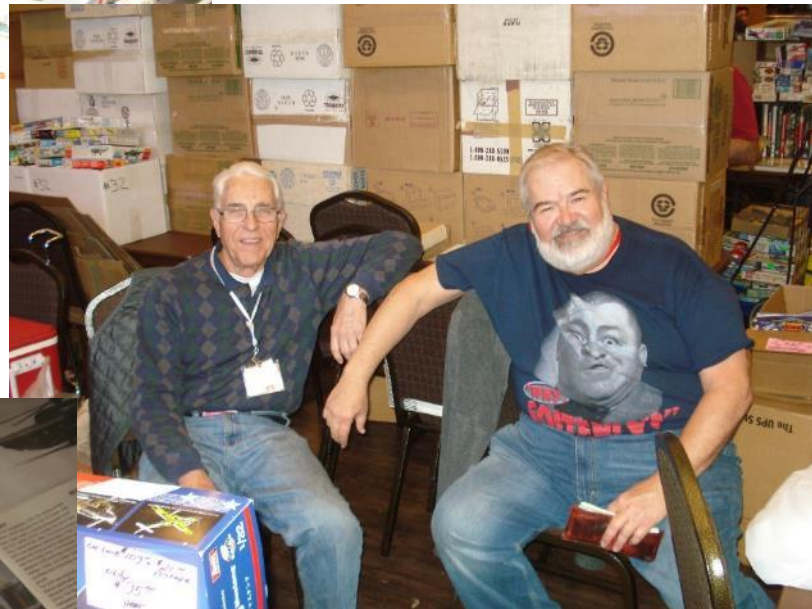
### Kit Collectors Show
