THE GREATEST ADVENTURE: MAN'S JOURNEY TO THE MOON, airs Friday, March 8, 9:00 p.m.

On July 16, 1969, three men began a four-day journey that would forever change the human perception of the universe. They were Neil Armstrong, Edwin Aldrin, Jr., and Michael Collins. Their vehicle was the Apollo 11. Their destination was the moon. Orson Welles narrates this program which traces the history of American space exploration from Robert Goddard's invention of the first liquid fuel rocket to the historic lunar landing. The program includes interviews with NASA Director of Launch Operations Rocco Petrone, Mercury astronaut Alan Shepard and The Right Stuff author Tom Wolfe. Breathing NASA photography is part of the program.

AIR FORCE ONE: THE PLANES AND THE PRESIDENTS, airs Monday, March 18, 7:00 p.m., repeats Wednesday, March 20, 11:00 p.m.

For the past forty years, Air Force One, the "Oval Office of the sky", has been witness to a wide range of events uniquely American. It has been the scene of enormous power and intrigue, great joy and profound sorrow. This documentary, hosted and narrated by James Stewart, features exclusive interviews with President Reagan and former Presidents Carter and Ford. Historic film footage, reminiscences by Presidential aides and former Air Force One pilots and crews, and a chronicle of the several planes to bear the Air Force One designation tell a story which combines a fascinating review of technology with a glimpse of Presidential life in the twentieth century.

GHOSTS OF THE SKY, airs Monday, March 18, 8:00 p.m., repeats Tuesday, March 19, 11:30 p.m.

In December, 1983, five men who called themselves the "Aero Heritage" attempted to fly a 40-year-old veteran World War II bomber from San Francisco to Sydney, Australia. The plane, a B-25 Mitchell bomber, was never designed to fly a journey of that length. Because of the nature of the flight and the age of the plane, this would surely be the first and last time that a flight of this kind would be attempted. To make the journey, the plane had been fitted with a specially built ferry tank for fuel. The trip included stops at Pearl Harbor, Marjuro, and Guadalcanal. The program features a special appearance by Glenn Ford and spectacular aerial photography of the plane in flight.

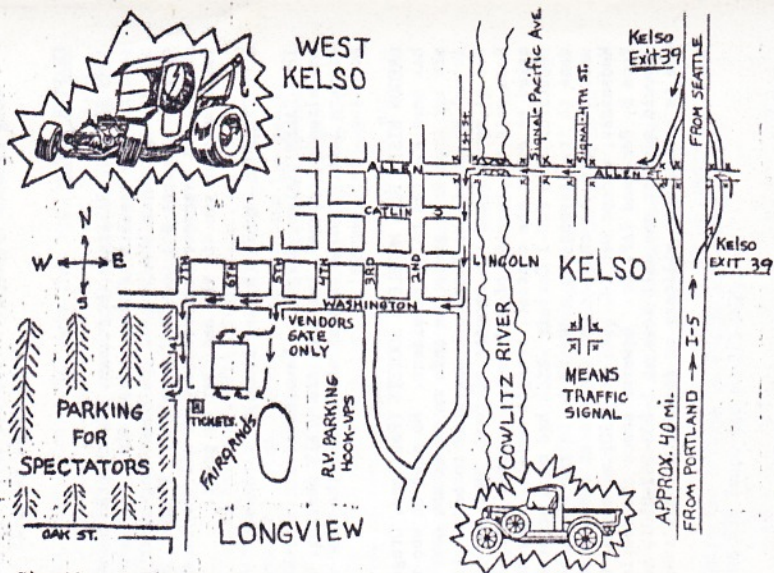
