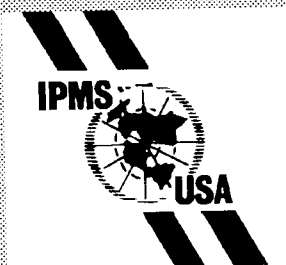
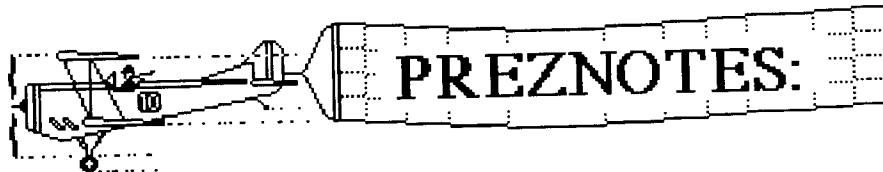

## Try other modeling subjects!

Are you a well rounded modeler? By that I don't mean is your waist size larger than your inseam. What I mean is that if all you build is 48th single engine Slobovian trainers, eventually you may run out of subjects to model (the Slobovians didn't have that many trainers - and even fewer fighters). Why not try something completely different. The Pentathlon at the Recon 7 contest in March is a terrific example. Airplane modelers building cars. Armor modelers building ships. Car modelers painting figures. And so on. As an aircraft and figure modeler, I have always shied away from doing cars or ships. Cars primarily because of the paint finish. But, to increase my knowledge of car modelling, I have built a few. I had to ask a lot of questions, make phone calls at odd hours to known car modelers to find out about certain techniques, but it was worth it! More ideas learned to add to my modeling knowledge. Conversely, I recently helped an auto modeler that had never attempted an aircraft before and didn't know how to use flat paints. Try an armor model. They require a whole different mode of assembly and finish and they are a great way to learn about washes and dry brushing. Then there are figures. Put your airbrush away. Find the oil paints and your red sable brush. Paint the entire model by hand - Learn to paint shadows and highlights by just mixing paints. There are many ideas in these other areas of modelling that you can apply to your own area of interest. So why not try something completely different. Today. See you at the meeting.

## 1997 ReCon Report

Once again the Seattle IPMS spring thing occurred on schedule March 22.

The various category winners and all the details are included later in this newsletter, for your amazement. As one of these things does not just happen, but is the result of a lot of prior work, it seems appropriate that this summary should at least attempt to acknowledge those who put in effort to put on a good show.

First and perhaps foremost, is the Prez — **Terry Moore**. Every time I would call him and ask "What about...." or "Whose doing...." or "Do we need...." The Mad Modeler from Lynnwood would have things firmly in hand. There are a zillion little details with one of these things, and Terry addressed most of them. Not happy with just the planning, he signed up the various vendors and actually showed up Friday to help set up and keep track of us flunkies as we did his bidding. Then he showed up Saturday and did his usual M/C thing. Thanks Terry, it was an outstanding effort!!

Next in line are our contest co-chairmen. **Ted Holowchuk** and **Jim Schubert** had that situation well in hand. While it is true that the categories and awards are an on-going process, each year the trends in our modeling require some tweaking and adjustment. Several planning sessions are held both before and after the contest to determine if we have everything covered. One of the things most of us don't realize is the amount of paperwork required. And it all needs to be done very early so that it can be included with the advertising and flyers for the event. Early planning is also needed to ensure that the awards are ready when the contest occurs. In my opinion one of the most important-and difficult- jobs in the whole show is recruiting judges. Good judges make or break the whole

thing. In my opinion we have been blessed with outstanding judges over the last several contests. Ted and Jim have participated in both our IPMS Seattle and Northwest Scale Modelers contests, and the commonality of rules, categories, judges and judging has worked to both groups advantage.

Contest registration is a real potential ball of snakes. If everyone's entry form, name, address etc. isn't very carefully recorded, and the entry fees collected, everything else quickly turns into a fiasco. **Bill Johnson** kept a firm hand on this end of things and the results were a very smooth flow of entrants and spectators coming into the show. A lot of questions need to be answered and a lot of information given out when the people come in, and Bill handled this very well.

The "Floor Boss" is an often overlooked part of this show, and we have been blessed with a really good one in **Robert Allen**. This is the guy who keeps everyone moving from the registration area to the proper area to place their models. Where do I put my models? Where is this category? No more room left on the table in that category! Where, Where, Why, Why... Robert deals with this all day long. This is also probably a good place to mention the Veep - **Keith Laird** was all over the place helping out. Chasing table locations, entry fees, registration, vendors room etc. Next year these guys need more help!

A name that I did not expect to see on this list this year, after having carried the load for several previous years, was **Andrew Birkbeck**. He stepped up to the plate and handled the awards and table co-ordination again. One of the good things you will notice when you get to the contest results is that he even had some time to build and enter a few models. One of the things I have learned is that it does not take much in the way of outside interests to kill most of your modeling time. Even if the outside interest is

related, the results are often the same-very little modeling gets done. Nice to see Andrew "retired" and building.

Another group that always seems to just show up and make short work of what could be a real chore is the set up and tear-down crew. These guys come in to a room that may be full of non-related junk, and in short order they have it cleared out and some 50 plus tables correctly positioned. This year there was a Humvee sitting in the middle of the room when I got there! You armor guys would probably have loved having it as a centerpiece, but it raised hell with my carefully laid out table arrangement. When we are done with the contest room, the vendor room gets the same treatment. These troops make things happen quickly and correctly. One of the highlights for me has been the "Lets go get some dinner" after the setup and tear down is over. These "after hours" things are really fun, and have provided a chance to get to know people that you might not normally get a chance to meet. This "stage crew" will be listed later in this newsletter. Thanks guys!!

The vendors that come and peddle their wares also should be recognized as essential parts of the day's successes. Yeah, I know, they come to sell us stuff, so why should we thank them? If you don't think they play a significant part in our success, try getting into the vendor room during the day! It is usually crammed all day long. By about 2PM almost everyone has a handful (car full??) of neat stuff from that room. As treasurer, I should point out that the table rental income also helps us keep the red ink out of our books. Those that shared their wares with us this year also are listed later. Thanks guys, for taking time away from your businesses to help us be successful.

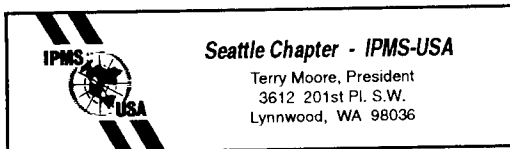
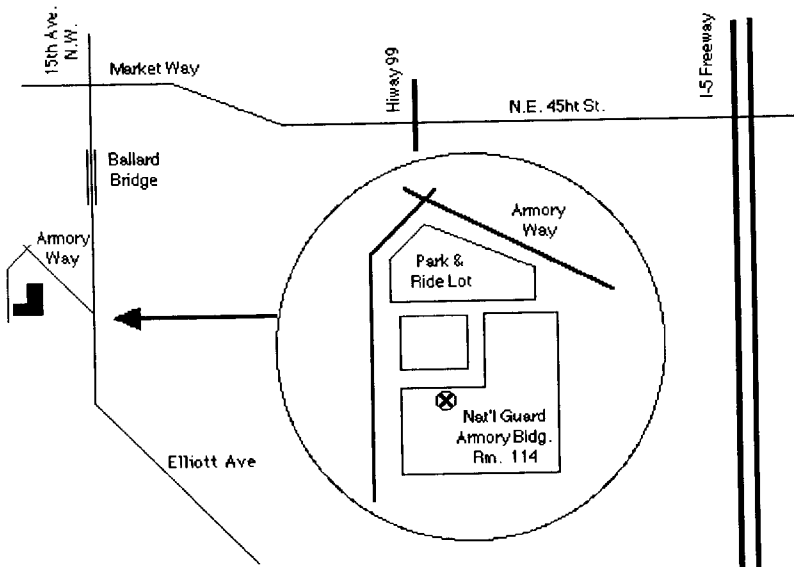
