




Interchangeable Ordnance - Using Neodymium Magnets by Chris Vandegrift

One of the love - hate relationships I have in modeling jets is deciding what ordnance to put under it. I love looking for the biggest payload. I hate deciding on just one! There's so many cool combinations out there. How do you decide what to put under it? Google makes for even more hours of indecision as now you can often see unique load-outs, standard load-outs, and read anecdotes from aviation ordnance-men! On my recent F-18A build I ran across just this case. So many options and acronyms to learn - SEAD, Fast FAC, PGM missions, surface attack, who knew.

I used to work for a company that used magnets extensively. Knowing there were these extremely strong neodymium magnets out there I thought it's time to see how small they come. Turns out they have a size now that works well for 1/32 jets. And if the magnet you use won't be visible then there are all kinds of options that can turn your model into a variable showpiece, different every time you put it on display. Here's a recap of how I setup the ordnance on my F-18 and the lessons I learned. I hope you enjoy it and have enough information to try it out yourself. I'll look for applications at future meetings.





These are currently the smallest they have, 0.07 lbs force. Don't try to work with just 1 magnet. The magnet Two of these are just enough to hold a 1/32 belly tank. stack allows you to hold it in place for cementing.



The opposing magnet goes on the rail. In this case I Close up shot of the magnets CA'd into the slot. didn't have to drill a hole to get the correct gap between the rail and the ordnance. If needed you can drill a small 1/32" diameter hole for the magnet.



Finished product! Lesson learned here too... the magnets flip easily. Double check that your poles are aligned, or you will have a jet ready to drop its ordnance instead of hold onto it if you know what I mean.
