

The USS Ward Challenge by Rob Schorry

The USS Ward (DD-139) was a four-stack destroyer which had the honor of being the first USN vessel to sink an IJN craft. They reported sinking a Japanese midget-sub near the entrance of Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. Strangely the Ward was sunk just three years later to the day due to attacks by Kamikaze aircraft.

The *Ward's* Pearl Harbor claim was rebutted by Navy. It was only after finding the sub's wreck in 2002 their kill was confirmed. The wreck was found in American waters 1,200 ft down about 4 miles outside Pearl Harbor. The starboard side of the Japanese submarine's conning tower has one shell hole, evidence of damage from *Ward*'s number-three gun.

Our club president, Mike Ward, accepted my challenge to build this ship model by our club contest in 2020. It is only fitting that a model of 'the *Ward*' gets built by 'a Ward.'

IPMS/USA Chattanooga National Convention - Rob Schorry

I attended the 2019 Nats in Chattanooga (the 'Nooga Nats) and had a great time. The model room, and its contents, set records. There were 3,112 entries in the 177 contest categories, along with 1,675 models entered as 'Display Only' for a total of 4,787 models. There were 961 registered attendees (i.e. IPMS members) and 139 of them brought models for Display Only. Builders from the USA, Canada, Japan, Spain, Venezuela, and Argentina were in the contest. I saw several CSM members there and it was good to see some of our group there. I gave a seminar, attended five more, and had a great time seeing old friends and making new ones.

And as a *first* there was an engagement. Randy Ray proposed to Eugenie Taylor on August 7, the first day of the convention, which conveniently was the anniversary of their first date. The happy couple are both model builders and we hope to see them at future conventions.

The 2020 Nats will be in San Marcos, Texas. The 2021 Nats were awarded to Las Vegas, Nevada, and the 2022 Nats will be in Omaha, Nebraska. The 2020 Nats website is: <u>www.Nats2020.com</u>






















Join IPMS/USA!
