Minutes of the 17 April 2018 General Meeting

President Chris Merseal called the meeting to order at 7:42 pm. There were 28 people, but no guests, in attendance.

Merseal showed off the certificate and letter the club received from the US Marine Corps Reserve for our Toys for Tots donation last December. He also announced that the build nights will be discontinued, due to lack of interest, in favor of programs at meetings having Modeler of the Year contests. Merseal talked of the point system for club contributions (newsletter articles, meeting programs) being instituted, with points going to an end of year raffle.

The AMPS Nationals in early May were plugged by Merseal, who also brought in two Lindberg Pirates of the Caribbean kits. He also said that investors have recently bought Revell (USA and Germany). Bill Wagner said we need members to staff our table at the MMVA show in Kirkwood early next month. He also made flyers for our September show.

Marion Morris stated that one must be a club member to enter our Beauty Contests and Modeler of the Year contests. He also said he's taking riders with him to the Regional in Branson in May; contact Morris if interested. Merseal said vendor tables for our contest are going fast. He also mentioned that there will be a membership rate increase for those members wishing to receive their newsletters via US Mail.

Morris brought in Panda's 1:35 M1 Abrams (with 105mm gun) kit; which he didn't think was a good kit for the money.

In Show and Tell: Jim Triola with the Special Hobby 1:32 Tempest Mk V "Hi-Tech" in progress; Tom Bogacki with his 1:48 A-4 Skyhawk built for the Jefferson Barracks POW-MIA Museum, in the markings of Capt. Bernie Plassmeyer, who went MIA over South Vietnam on 11 Sept. 1970; Bob Delaney with his Hobby Boss 1:48 RF-80A Shooting Star in progress;. Mark Carroll mentioned that the Mark Twain Model Club now meets at a library in St. Charles.

After a break, Bill Wagner did a demo on making snow for models and bases. He uses baking soda, white acrylic paint, and white glue for the snow.

The Beauty Contest drew six entries, and was won by John Mueller's Admiral Graf Spee. He selected Meng's 1:35 Panther Ausf A kit for his prize. The raffle winners and prizes were: Vince Murphy, \$5 Schaefer's Hobby Shop gift certificate; and, Mark Carroll, \$5 CRM Hobbies gift certificate.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:01 pm.

A Note from the Treasurer, Rick Keasey:

For those of you who don't know, I was elected Chapter Treasurer this past December. Since then, I have been balancing the Club's books and discovered something interesting:

The cost of mailing newsletters was \sim \$24 per person, leaving the Club with a \sim \$9.00 deficit per person receiving the newsletter by mail. The math worked out like this.

 ~ 10 pages X \$0.15 per page = \$1.50.

\$1.50 for pages + \$.50 per stamp = \$2.00 per newsletter.

\$2.00 per newsletter X 12 newsletters per year = \$24 per year.

\$24 per person X 10 persons - \$240.00

Everyone knows that over time inflation insidiously creeps into everything, including our Club's financials. The fact of the matter is, annual dues now go toward paying for the church, door prizes, printing various forms, the PO Box, club picnic, etc. Spending an additional \$24 per member for 10 members is deficit spending and is fiscally irresponsible. Therefore, the E-Board has unanimously decided to charge members wishing to receive a mailed newsletter an additional \$15 per year, making their total dues \$30 per year. This will be effective starting 01 July 2018. To be clear, for the additional \$15, you will receive a condensed, 5-page monthly newsletter via the U.S. Postal Service. The newsletter editor will do his best to include all pertinent Club information within the allotted 5 pages, but it cannot be guaranteed.

Request for Car Models to Be Built

Sir, I am Dave Carroll, a 74-year-old living in Dixon, Missouri and have two 1:25 scale Moebius models of 1954 Hudson Hornets: One Hornet Club Coupe and one '54 Hornet Special. I would like to find an expert that can assemble these models to show the difference between the two cars. I tried to judge my ability to assemble models (like I did growing up) by starting on a '66 Chevy SS, and quickly found I do not have the dexterity, vision, or feeling in my hands to put the models together. The reason I want these models detailed like the real Hudsons is to show the difference between the two cars.

When we go to car shows, our Hudson Hornet Club Coupe is usually the only one there and I try and answer all questions about these great cars and will use the models to point out the difference in the trim levels. In 1954, Hudson merged with Nash-Kelvinator Corporation and formed American Motors, making my Hornet the last year for a Hudson built body. With a total of 24,888 Hornets and Hornet Specials built in '54, this made them relatively rare.

I am willing to pay the modeler for the work. We will be attending an Orphan Car Display at the National Museum of Transportation in Kirkwood, Missouri on 3 June 2018 to allow anyone to see a real Hudson Hornet along with other Hudsons and cars they do not make any longer.


Editor's Note


