## Minutes of the 18 September 2018 General Meeting

Vice President Bill Wagner—filling in for President Chris Merseal, who was unwell—called the meeting to order at 7:39 pm. There were 27 people in attendance, including four first time attendees.

Wagner thanked all who helped our Invitational to be a success. There were generally good comments about our show. Contest Chairman Marion Morris requested judges for the Modeler of the Year Contest. Dave Roeder and Scott Van Aken stepped up.

The Adult Building Course (ABC) is underway in Edwardsville, Wagner said. The 11 students (about double last year's total) are building Tamiya's 1:48 scale M4A3E8 Sherman kit. This class will run Wednesdays until 10 October. Treasurer Rick Keasey said about half of the students have building experience.

Keasey talked through the new Google Sites page he developed for us. Wagner said we can go forward with this site. Input is always welcome from the membership. Wagner thanked Doug Barton for his work on our old website. Keasey put the link to the new site up on our Facebook page. Secretary Bob Delaney set up a club Twitter account @IPMSGateway.

In Show & Tell: John Mueller with four World War I fighters, an E.III, DH.2, SE-5A, and D.VII; Tom Bogacki with Academy UH-1 Work in Progress (WIP) and a howitzer WIP; Delaney with Dragon 1:700 Admiral Nakhimov WIP; visitor Michael Georg with 1:72 F6F Hellcat and P-47 Thunderbolt; and, Don Will with his Warhammer figure that won its category and Best Figure at the IPMS/West Central Missouri show last month.

Delaney showed the Third Place certificate his release on our 2017 Toys for Tots donation earned from the National Federation of Press Women. After a short break, Wagner did a demo on scenery materials.

Morris announced the Modeler of the Year contest results. There were 20 entries, including seven in the "To the Rescue" Special Category. Prize drawing winners and prizes were: Mark Carroll with the Tamiya 1:48 M4A3E8 Sherman kit; and, Scott Allen and John Mueller each winning a \$5 CRM Hobbies gift certificate.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:48 pm.

## Report on the 25 September 2018 Business Meeting

Six members attended the meeting, which Marion Morris hosted at The Muddled Pig Gastropub in Maplewood, Missouri. President Chris Merseal called it to order at 7:10

pm.

In Old Business, Merseal went over expenses and income from our Invitational; these were better than last year's show. He said the raffle and Make & Take will be in the hotel atrium next year, and there will be no food sales next year.

In New Business, Treasurer Rick Keasey explained the recent and proposed club budget (with handouts), which the board discussed. He suggested we have an agenda set for our general meetings, and proposed ending the Beauty contest in favor of Show & Tell starting in March 2019.

Director Jim Triola proposed adjusting the meeting room to have tables forming a U-shape around the seating area, with members sitting next to their Show & Tell items. There would also be a table for display at the room's rear. The board suggested we try this in 2019 and see how this goes.

There was discussion of meeting ideas, and the need was found for a video system setup for meeting demos. Morris said he would do this. Keasey said he would look into getting a GoPro camera, while Vice President Bill Wagner would look into getting a laptop computer.

Merseal said the club should subsidize t-shirts or polo shirts for members. Secretary Bob Delaney offered to do a roll call list for the meetings. Keasey said we should use name tags at the meetings. He would also look into organizing a club Christmas party. Merseal suggested four to five kits as ideas for the Same Kit Contest, and let the builders vote on the kit to be built.

Meeting adjourned 8:35 pm.

## Member Spotlight

### Marion Morris

I'm an Air Force brat. I was born in West Virginia, but when I was born (1951), my dad was in Korea. When he came home, he joined the Air Force. Consequently, we started the moving routine over the next 27 years.

I lived in Gosnell, Arkansas, right outside Blytheville from 5th grade to half way through my junior year in high school, when Dad was transferred to Wright-Patterson Air Force Base. So, I went from a junior class of 40 kids to Stebbins High School of over 350 kids. Boy what a culture shock!!! The high school was next to Wright Field. My bedroom window looked out to the famous Wright Field. I saw the "new" Air Force Museum being built in the late 60s and the XB-70 land at Wright-Pat on its way to the Museum—what a thrill. I graduated from high school in 1969 and attended the University of Dayton on a 4-year Army ROTC scholarship. This was not the time to be in the Army ROTC program in any college, but it paid for everything, tuition, lodging, books, etc. I couldn't refuse the opportunity that it provided. I graduated from University of Dayton with a B.S. in Geology in 1973 and joined the Army for 4 years (1973-1977) as an Airborne Ranger, leaving me little time to build models. Thereafter, I spent 10 years in the Missouri National Guard, as an artillery officer. I continued my education and graduated from Mizzou with a M.S. in Forestry in 1983. Later that year, I made the move from Columbia, MO to St. Louis where I worked as a Department of Defense Cartographer for over 30 years. I retired from cartography in 2013 and worked part time at Maplewood Bicycle shop, retiring from there in Sept 2018.

I have been married to my wife, Regina, for over 40 years. We met at the University of Dayton. She's from Syracuse, New York. We have three children: Chris, Elizabeth, and Maria. They are all grown and married off. I have 6 granddaughters, ages 14 to under a year.

I built my first model, the Monogram B-66B with a dropping A-bomb, in 1960, when I was in third grade. My dad was a gunner in the Air Force, a crew member in the B-29, B-40, B-36, B-66, and the B-52. He spent most of his time in the Strategic Air Command (SAC). So, I fell in love with the aircraft of the 50s and 60s. When I completed it, I made sure that everyone knew where my Dad sat in the airplane, on the left side, right behind the pilot. I stopped building around 7th grade, when sports and girls took a higher priority. I restarted building models when my brother gave my son a 1/48 Monogram F-14 for Christmas in 1987. We built it and had a great time, and I



got hooked again. We started to look for a modeling club, found Gateway in Jan 1988 and joined the club. The rest is history...

I have many favorite model subjects, but if I had to build only one subject, it would be the Bf-109E and the Sherman tank. Both had many variations and color schemes that would keep me busy for a long time. I started out building 1/72, then 1/48, then now 1/32, with an occasional 1/35 military vehicle. I have probably built around 150+ kits with around 30 on display, but I haven't counted them lately. During my youth during the 60s, I built all of the 1/72 Revell aircraft. That was a great time in the hobby.

I've been an IPMS Gateway member for over 25 years. I have always enjoyed the people and the club because we all have a common interest in scale modeling, but with completely different backgrounds. The club is very dynamic and fun, with a lot of great people cooperating to keep the club and hobby fun and growing. So, when you come to the club meetings or activities, you should feel like your opinions count. We need everyone to participate in the club meeting, contests, e-board meetings, and club activities, to keep the club dynamic and growing. Remember that you don't have to be a great modeler; even after building for 25 years, I have a lot to learn and share. I have held all the club offices at one time or another. Currently, I am the chapter contact and a National IPMS senior judge for armor. I was also the President of the St. Louis Armor Modeling club, which was active from 1995-2005.

I have won some 1st places in local contests, regional shows, mainly in armor, but I had a "Best Aircraft" and "Best Naval Aircraft" at a show. I have also won "Best Armor" at the 2012 Gateway Invitational.

In addition to modeling, I enjoy bicycling, running, golf, and being a Grandpa.
