Minutes of the 15 May 2018 General Meeting

Vice President Bill Wagner—presiding in President Chris Merseal's absence—called the meeting to order at 7:36 pm. There were 24 people, but no guests, in attendance.

The second 2018 Modeler of the Year contest was held, with the Special Category of "Crazy Eights" (anything with an 8 in the name or designation). Scott Van Aken and Jim Victor judged the contest, which drew 28 entries—18 in the Special Category.

Rick Keasey gave a demo on painting figure heads, which showed the materials and techniques he uses.

Show and Tell: Van Aken with Hasegawa's 1:72 F-35B Lightning II kit. He also mentioned that, starting in June, Tamiya was not allowing retailers to undercut their prices, with those retailers violating that policy prevented from further selling Tamiya products. Doug Barton brought his Hasegawa 1:450 Akagi in progress. Keasey showed off his three award-winning models from the AMPS Nationals earlier that month in Dayton, Ohio. He added that a photo of one of those models would appear this fall in *FineScale Modeler*. Tom Bogacki brought in a punch tool for making leaves from paper or similar material.

Wagner recapped that month's MMVA show in Kirkwood, Mo., where we had a table to promote the club and our Invitational. He mentioned that a vendor there saw our article in the *IPMS/USA Journal* about last year's Adult Building Course, and signed up as a vendor at our show. Wagner also brought in show flyers for members to distribute.

Treasurer Keasey had new club membership forms for renewals, and a few members filled theirs out. He also mentioned contacting KTVI (Ch. 2) about doing a promo for our Invitational and our Toys for Tots fundraising with the station later this summer. Secretary Bob Delaney announced that the Member Spotlight would start next month. He also mentioned that his publicity efforts for the club last year were recognized with awards by the Missouri Professional Communicators.

Contest Chairman Marion Morris announced the contest results. The raffle prizes and winners were: Airfix 1:48 Meteor F.8 kit, Dave Roeder; \$5 CRM Hobbies gift certificate, Dave Roeder (donated to another member); \$5 CRM Hobbies gift certificate, Doug Barton.

We also received a kit donation to our Invitational's raffle benefitting Toys for Tots, and more donations would be welcome. Meeting adjourned at 8:52 pm.

Minutes of the 31 May 2018 Business Meeting

Rick Keasey hosted the business meeting. After dinner there, President Chris Merseal called the meeting to order at 7:52 pm. Seven members attended.

The General Meeting on 19 June 2018 at Calvary Presbyterian Church was planned. Marion Morris will give a demo on using Mission Models and MRP (Mr. Paint) paints, comparing them using the Bf 109s he's building. We'll also begin the membership renewal cycle (applications to be included with the June newsletter); there will be a Model of the Month "Beauty Contest;" Show & Tell; Bob Delaney will begin distributing Member Spotlight questionnaires; and the club will begin recording member participation in club activities for a special year-end raffle. The raffle prizes will be a Bandai Star Wars Darth Vader figure and two \$5 gift certificates.

The E-Board also planned the 17 July 2018 General Meeting, also at Calvary. This will be the club's annual Slam Fest, which starts at 7:00 pm SHARP. Members have two hours to assemble and finish a kit, which will then be judged by members. The top three vote getting models will be awarded \$5 gift certificates (three for first place, two for second, and one for third).

Morris will coordinate a judging seminar at the 21 August 2018 General Meeting at Calvary. A "Beauty Contest" will also be held that night.

Old Business began with the Invitational on 8 September. Merseal brought in trophy sponsor labels left over from last year. Bill Wagner volunteered to do these labels this year. Morris will pick up and check the trophies two weeks before the show. He will also get the category list to the trophy maker. A design is needed for the Best of Show, People's Choice and Theme Awards, which will incorporate a photo of the winning model. Wagner said he has a photo printer that may be suitable for this task. Keasey will handle the kit raffle. Delaney and Regina Morris will work the front door, while Scott Allen will help where needed. Merseal said we need to mention trophy sponsors at the awards presentation; Delaney, Marion Morris, and Jim Triola said that was not the case at MOSS CON.

The Club Participation Award was discussed next. The E-Board discussed a year-end raffle for members who participated in club activities during the year. A point system was discussed, and Morris suggested a gift certificate as an attendance prize at each meeting. The E-Board agreed to the award's participation criteria: judging at Modeler of the Year contests; Show & Tell; working at the Invitational; writing newsletter articles; entering

"Beauty Contests;" and giving demos at meetings. Delaney was asked to write up the criteria. This would start with the June General Meeting. The E-Board agreed to award two \$50 gift cards in the year-end raffle.

The E-Board then talked about the Member Spotlight, with Delaney passing along a pilot article of himself. Merseal suggested we develop a questionnaire to give to members. Keasey also suggested we do an online photo gallery of members.

In New Business, Morris said we would use a different pavilion for our picnic on 9 Sept. at Deer Creek Park in Maplewood, as the one we used last year was not available to us. He added that the pavilion reservation has been paid to the parks department.

Keasey asked for someone to serve as the club's Equipment Custodian, per the revised Constitution and By-Laws. Wagner agreed to do so. Keasey also said would do our Adult Building Course at the Edwardsville Library late this summer, starting prior to our Invitational.

Wagner suggested that the club purchase a video camera for recording our demos. He would price out the camera, projector, and tripod for the E-Board to consider.

Keasey will send Delaney the new membership form for inclusion with the June newsletter.

Wagner will host the next Business Meeting on 24 July 2018, and Morris will host another Business Meeting on 28 August.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:52 pm.

A Note from the Treasurer, Rick Keasey:

For those of you who don't know, I was elected Chapter Treasurer this past December. Since then, I have been balancing the Club's books and discovered something interesting:

The cost of mailing newsletters was ~\$24 per person, leaving the Club with a ~\$9.00 deficit per person receiving the newsletter by mail. The math worked out like this.

 \sim 10 pages X \$0.15 per page = \$1.50.

\$1.50 for pages + \$.50 per stamp = \$2.00 per newsletter.

\$2.00 per newsletter X 12 newsletters per year = \$24 per year.

\$24 per person X 10 persons - \$240.00

Everyone knows that over time inflation insidiously creeps into everything, including our Club's financials. The fact of the matter is, annual dues now go toward paying for the church, door prizes, printing various forms, the PO Box, club picnic, etc. Spending an additional \$24 per member for 10 members is deficit spending and is fiscally irresponsible. Therefore, the E-Board has unanimously decided to charge members wishing to receive a mailed newsletter an additional \$15 per year, making their total dues \$30 per year. This will be effective starting 01 July 2018. To be clear, for the additional \$15, you will receive a condensed, 5-page monthly newsletter via the U.S. Postal Service. The newsletter editor will do his best to include all pertinent Club information within the allotted 5 pages, but it cannot be guaranteed.


