Minutes of the 19 February 2019 General Meeting

President Rick Keasey called the meeting to order at 7:33 pm. There were 23 attendees, including two guests: Lawrence Sigel, a first-timer who found out about us on Facebook; and, Caleb Duttlinger's father, Andrew.

Secretary Bob Delaney called the roll, then Keasey mentioned our use of an agenda at meetings.

In Old Business, Vice President Bill Wagner would hold a 50/50 raffle at this meeting, with proceeds to a charity to be determined. Keasey asked for member biographies for the newsletter and website. Members can send photos of their models to Keasey for the website. Articles needed for the newsletter; contact Delaney on this matter.

In Current Business, Keasey said we will have more demos, no "Beauty Contests," and more raffle prizes at our meetings. He asked us to start thinking of pot luck items to bring to our Christmas dinner party.

Treasurer Jim Victor began collecting money for club polo shirts. Purple will be the official shirt color; however, other colors are available. He said later that night that 24 shirts had been sold so far. Victor will take more money next month, then place the order.

The first 2019 Modeler of the Year Contest—the annual Out of the Box Contest—was held. Contest Chairman Marion Morris asked for judges; Wagner and Scott Van Aken volunteered.

We are nominating ourselves for Region 5 Chapter of the Year, Keasey said. Delaney will write up the nomination.

Our membership year is now on a calendar year basis, so those who joined up in mid-2018 will get six free months of membership. Renewals will start late this fall.

Keasey plugged our Invitational contest on 14 September. We are seeking trophy sponsors.

He said last month's Kit Auction raised \$423 for club activities.

Keasey said that John Bione became our first electronic enrollee, having joined up on our website earlier that month. He also announced that a Work In Progress (WIP) page has been added to the website for members to share their images.

Keasey also encouraged members to bring their models in next month to have pictures taken of them.

He also hopes a large number of us can go together to the IPMS/USA National Convention in Chattanooga, Tennessee on 7-10 August. Director Jim Triola mentioned shows in Kansas City and Indianapolis on 9 March.

In Show & Tell: Triola had Merit's 1:200 scale USS Hornet (CV-8) WIP, showing components done so far (lifeboats, anti-aircraft guns, part of the hangar deck). Triola plans to build it with VT-8 TBDs on deck for the Battle of Midway; Chris Merseal with two 1:48 Shermans (Tamiya M4A3E8 and Bandai M4A3 105mm) he'll kit bash; Keasey showed his diorama with Takom's 1:35 M47E in Spanish markings; Jim Roeder seeks a 1:72 Macchi MC.200 or MC.202 kit.

After a brief break, while contest judging continued, Keasey did his demo on painting uniforms on figures. Several members viewed the demo, which employed a World War II German soldier figure.

Wagner announced that the 50/50 drawing raised \$38, with Keasey winning \$19 and the other \$19 going to charity.

Morris announced the contest results, which are listed elsewhere in this newsletter. Raffle tickets were drawn: Morris won Wolfpack's 1:48 T-38C Talon, and Scott Allen won Bandai's Star Wars Death Star Attack Set.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:47 pm.

Modeler of the Year May 2019 Contest: Check for last month's Modeler of the Year results, given above. The next Modeler of the Year (MOY) contest is May 2019. The special category for the MOY in May is: Six is a Serious Number. If the subject of the model of an aircraft, ship, car, etc. has a title, name, or nickname including the word or number Six, e.g. F-16, F-86, A6M Zero, or a six as a part of the advertisement on an automobile, etc., so you're your imagination. Remember that you will get two extra points for just entering the Special Category. If you have a question on your entry, please contact me (my contact information is on the back of the newsletter).

2019 Modeler of the Year Contests

19 February. Special Category: Out of the Box (ALL ENTRIES)

21 May. Special Category: 6 is a Serious Number (6/Six in the subject's name or designation)

17 September. Special Category: Let's Go Topless (Open cockpit aircraft, convertible cars, open-topped armored vehicles, etc.)

19 November. Special Category: Italiano (Italian subjects)

Each contest has these regular categories: Aircraft, Armor, Automotive, Ships, Space/Sci-Fi, Dioramas, Figures, Miscellaneous, and Juniors.

You receive one point for entering each model in the contest, and an additional point for entering in the Special Category. Category winners receive three points, second place earns two points, and third place gets one point. We operate with "no sweeps" rules, so you can only earn one prize per category, no matter how many entries you have in that category
