Minutes of the 19 June 2018 General Meeting

President Chris Merseal called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. There were 25 people, but no guests, in attendance.

Treasurer Rick Keasey began taking membership renewals. Member Spotlight questionnaires were distributed and began to be filled out.

Marion Morris presented a demo on Mission Master and MRP (Mr. Paint) paints. He sprayed the paints on the two 1:48 Bf 109G-6 kits he's working on.

In Show & Tell: David Allen with Mustang and Camaro cars in progress; Doug Barton with three 1:350 ships in progress (Trumpeter Hornet, Trumpeter Ranger, and Merit Yorktown); Gary Hogue with a 3D printed car frame and body; Rick Keasey with his two winning models (Best Figure and Best Diorama) from NIMCON in Crystal Lake, Illinois the previous Saturday, along with a brief show report.

There were 19 entries in the Model of the Month "Beauty Contest," which was won by John Mueller's Trumpeter 1:32 Ju 87. He chose a \$5 CRM Hobbies gift certificate as his prize. Raffle winners were: Mike Kuchar with the Bandai 1:12 Darth Vader kit; and Doug Barton with the \$5 CRM gift certificate.

Wagner appealed for kit donations for the raffle at our Invitational in September. Merseal brought in Takom's 1:35 Panther A with Zimmerit kit and an issue of Damanged magazine. Tom Bogacki said the POWS/MIA Museum at Jefferson Barracks was seeking a B-24J Liberator model for donation to a museum in Austria. Merseal spoke on the Club Participation Program, which began that night. Points would be tallied over the next year, with prizes raffled off in June 2019. He also sought the instruction sheets for Moebius' 1:72 Mk. VII Viper. Scott Van Aken mentioned checking on Hobby Search (www.1999.co.jp) for those sheets. Van Aken also asked about our plans to purchase audio visual equipment. Wagner explained that we were pricing out equipment for purchase.

Keasey encouraged members to do demos at our meetings. Merseal answered a question regarding aircraft dihedral. Bob Delaney mentioned the IPMS/Butch O'Hare Show in November in Itasca, Illinois. Keasey said that problems with the club's Google+ page have been fixed. Invitational flyers were available for members to take to shops and shows.

Merseal adjourned the meeting at 8:44 pm.

The Tale of Two Kits

(Editor's Note: Part 1 of this article—about building two 1:48 scale Bf 109G-6 kits-- appeared in the April 2018 issue of *The Arch Scaler News*. Due to space considerations, this article did not run last month as planned.)

Like most aircraft models, the next big job is the cockpit.

The Eduard kit uses the more traditional construction of the cockpit with added bonus of etched metal detail that Tamiya does not have. The etched metal adds details, color, and parts that would be difficult for the average modeler to produce. For example, the rudder pedals and straps are realistically produced with the etched metal. It's too bad you can't see them. Also, the belts and straps for the Eduard kit creates a beautiful and realistic representative of the real thing. Whereas the Tamiya kit portrays the same parts, but they are basically out of scale. Therefore, you get parts that are much larger than the 'real' subject. See diagrams 1 (Tamiya) and 2 (Eduard).

Another item is the seat belts. The Eduard kit pre-colored seat belts are excellent and provides beautiful and realistic seat belts that adds a lot of depth into the cockpit, which you can see with the unaided Mark 2 eyeball. Tamiya provides the modeler with a set of decals that you use for their seats. That's fine, but they are not very realistic to the eye. In Tamiya's defense, the detail is fine and again, and most of the time, you will never notice the oversized parts, when the cockpit is completed. See diagrams 3.

At last month's meeting, I did a demo using two different paints. One kit was painted with MRP (Mr. Paint) and the other model was painted with the new Mission Model paints. I hope you caught that demo.






Diagram 1: Tamiya's cockpit side walls





Member Spotlight

Rick Keasey

Rick was born and raised in Youngstown, Ohio. He moved to Detroit, Michigan at the age of sixteen. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant through the Michigan State University Air Force ROTC program in 1985 and became a KC-135 Stratotanker navigator. He was initially assigned to Castle AFB, CA and subsequently joined the Illinois Air National Guard in December of 1990. From 1986 to 2008, Rick flew over 3,500 flying hours and has logged combat support time in support almost every major contingency in which the U.S. has been involved, to include OPERATIONS: DESERT SHIELD, DESERT STORM, NORTHERN WATCH, JOINT FORGE, JOINT GUARD, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM, NOBEL EAGLE, just to name a few.

In 2008, Rick was promoted to Colonel and took command of the 126th Maintenance Group, overseeing the maintenance of 10 KC-135R Stratotankers and 350 personnel. In 2015, he retired after 30 years of service.

Rick married Cathleen in 1991. They met on a cruise after Rick came back from DESERT STORM. They have 5 children.

Rick started building models in 1970. He goes back and forth among building airplanes, tanks, dioramas, and figures. He is an IPMS Nationals award winning modeler, as he took a second place and a third place at his first National Contest in 2017.
