Jim Woody Memorial

With deep and profound sadness, we want to inform you of the passing of long time IPMS/USA and IPMS/OC member Jim Woody. James Stephen Woody died on August 29th after a long battle with cancer. His passing was peaceful and without pain.

Jim joined IPMS/USA after visiting the National Convention the first time it was held in Virginia Beach. There on vacation, they stumbled upon the event, but after just a few minutes there he realized that such an organization is just what he needed to improve is modeling skills, he joined on the spot.

A few months later, he joined the local chapter, IPMS/Orange County and readily stepped up to play key roles in the local club. Jim played a critical role in revitalizing IPMS Orange County back in the mid-1990s. Following a meltdown by the previous club officers, Jim and several others stepped to put the club back on an even keel. Serving as Treasurer for 15 years and later, also as Newsletter Editor. Jim played a very critical role in making IPMS Orange County the largest and most active Chapter in the region and helped make OrangeCon the great show it is today. In the years I served as Chapter President, Jim's calm, rational, manner was a great asset and his willingness to do any task, perform any role needed, were what was truly needed at the time. Many of us will remember him most for is warm and smiling greeting as they entered the club's monthly meeting.

Jim also served as Regional Coordinator for Region 8, overseeing and coordinating the individual Chapters in Southern California and Southern Nevada. For the past 13 years he also carried the role of Managing Editor of the IPMS/USA Journal.

Jim and his wife Lindy purchased Military Hobbies in Orange, California in 2005 from the shops' original owner. Owning a hobby shop is something all modelers dream about, but Jim achieved it. He was positively giddy when talking about and running the place. During their tenure of ownership, they grew the business and established it as the place to go for plastic models in Orange County. As many know, they sold Military Hobbies earlier this year as Jim's health got to the point he did not have the energy to run things as he wanted to. His desire was to see one of the few remaining hobby shops continue and thrive in other hands.

Many of you may not be aware, but Jim's 'Day Job' put him the role of installing and implementing software and training staff to operate specific main frame computer programs. His clients included Fortune 500 sized-companies, as well as government agencies, throughout the world. He was traveling on these assignments until just a few months ago.



Jim Woody Memorial

Jim was very proud of his service in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War. He began in the Naval Reserve flying in Anti-Submarine aircraft (Grumman S-2 Tracker) as an electronics operator. Later he was called to 'active duty' and trained as a Radar Intercept Officer (RIO) and promoted to Warrant Officer. Flying combat missions in the back seat of F-4 Phantoms he operated off the aircraft carrier USS Hancock (CVA-19) and was later seconded to the Marine Air Wing based at Da Nang as there was a shortage of RIOs at the time. Though he was hesitant to discuss some of his more traumatic experiences, he always made a point of proudly wearing a hat that identified him as a navy veteran of the Vietnam-era. It had one more, modeling related, and side effect. When judging models in model contests, he would check the back seat of Navy Phantoms to make sure they were properly done...and without a control stick for the RIO. As he would state with a smile, "In the Navy we didn't have to fly ourselves, we were chauffeured everywhere."

Jim is survived by his wife (and fellow modeler) Lindy, his son Stephen, Stephen's wife Christel and their two sons Wesley and Tobias. He is also survived by his mother Martha Woody and Sister Sue, niece Leslie and great nephew Connor. He also made Lindy's grandchildren Sophia and Anthony his own.



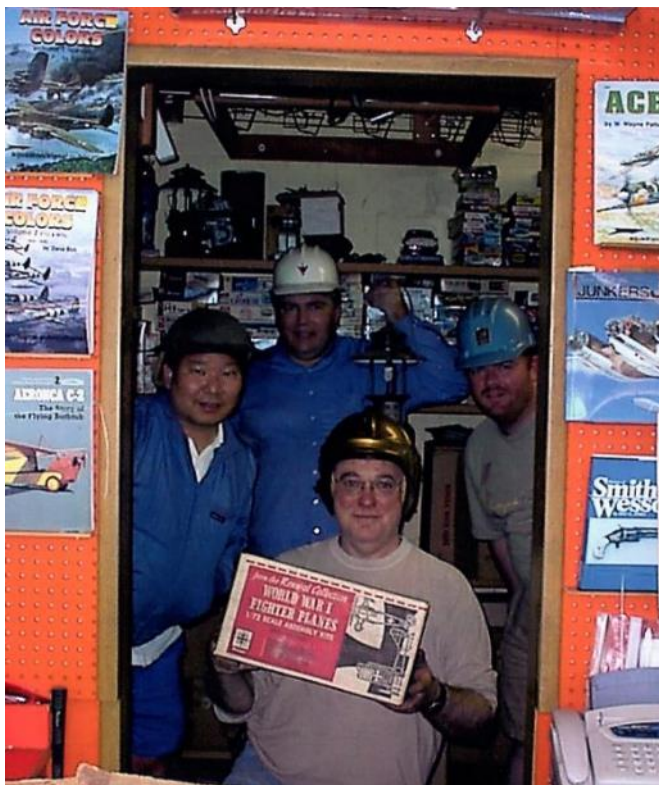
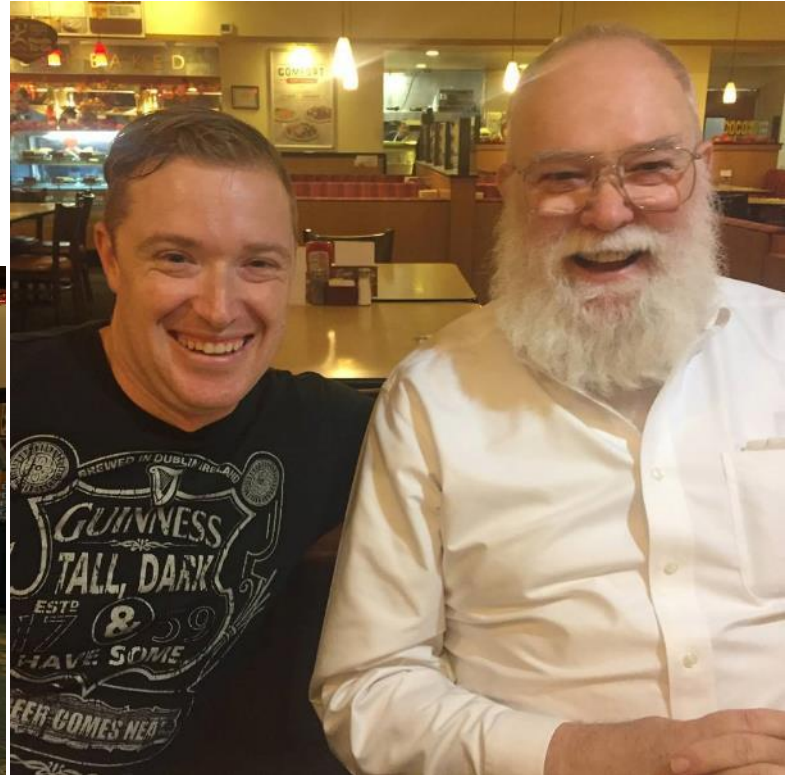

IMPORTANT ORANGECON UPDATE

Please read if you plan on going to the show

Dear Fellow Modelers,
OrangeCon is here!

By the time you receive this, OrangeCon 2018 will be about four weeks away – Saturday October 13th. We are busy ramping up to the final push so that we will have another successful and enjoyable event this year. The trophies are in hand, the vendor room is approaching being sold out and everyone we know is building models like mad to participate in the contest.

That said, we need to share with you some critical changes that have been forced upon us “at the last moment” by the venue there at Cal State Fullerton. Sadly, some of this will affect **all** vendors and attendees. For the record, we don’t like it either! But were stuck with it!

We have just been informed by the new Event Planner of the CSU Fullerton Titan Student Union (TSU) that they have a new cash handling policy (in fact it’s so new they don’t yet have it in writing!). The main change was that no cash could be transacted in the vendor room or out in the lobby. ***DON’T PANIC!*** We have developed a workaround solution and hope you will understand that we have no other choice to do this – other than canceling the event entirely – and there is no way we will do that!

After multiple meetings with the TSU management we agreed to comply changing where we take our general admission and model contest registration fees as well the tickets for our opportunity drawing from the lobby to their built-in ticket booth. The ticket booth is outside the door facing the parking structure many of you are familiar with. We will have signs and volunteers to help direct people to where they need to go.

All Vendors are fully able to sell **their** items in our vendor room, and **all** Buyers will still be able to buy that treasure you found for sale, but as Cash cannot be taken inside the vendor room at all, you will need to use the arrangement we agreed to use with TSU...so don’t worry. We created a method where you will use a cash substitute. We will **have** official OrangeCon “play money”, good only at OrangeCon on the day of the event.

We will have a sign at the entrance as well as volunteers informing everyone coming to the ticket book of the following. “Anyone wishing to purchase items in our vendor room must exchange their cash with officially approved TSU Bucks.” Then you can buy and sell just as it has always been. Vendors are allowed to take checks and credit/debit cards directly if they choose to do so.

At any point in the day, up to the end of the show, you will bring all the “play money” you have and come to the ticket booth and exchange it for real cash. ***All Vendors will not **lose** out in any sales or profit. All Buyers will still be able to buy to your heart’s content. Neither IPMS/OC, nor CSUF/TSU, is taking a cut or charging a fee to do this.***



IMPORTANT ORANGECON UPDATE

*This also impacts the Raffle – Now renamed – Opportunity drawing...because CSUF considers a raffle to be 'gambling'. In the Opportunity Drawing EVERYONE will receive one free **ticket** when they pay their admission. You will still have plenty of opportunity to purchase additional tickets if you wish to increase your Opportunity.*

The Contest portion of OrangeCon is unaffected by this wrinkle that has been thrust upon us. More than 50 categories, plus splits, all of the 'Best Of' awards and the Special Best RAF Subject trophy await you winners. One thing regarding the contest we want to address. There is a rumor going around, and we don't know who started it, but we want to kill it here and now. **For more *than* 25 years OrangeCon has allowed the winning models from the current year's IPMS National Convention to enter and compete.** Only National winners from previous years are not eligible to enter. **THAT RULE HAS NOT CHANGED! If your model won any award at this year's Nationals held in Phoenix, you can bring it to OrangeCon and enter it.**

We're sorry to hit you with all of this, but again, they didn't disclose this information to us until now. It is too late to try for any legal action which we feel we would have won because of the late disclosure. We're hoping to deal with this nuisance and still have a great event on October 13th and then move on to a new venue for OrangeCon 2019 that does not have this absurd requirement.

Of course, these kits will not replace our original designs; we will continue to produce as many original Salvino's J R Models kits as we had previously planned, but these will be additional as we will continue to supply American made model kits to the collectors! We would very much like to thank Pete and Rick of Atlantis Model Co. for giving us this opportunity to serve the stock car model community of builders and keep this hobby growing.

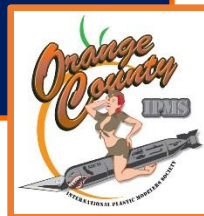

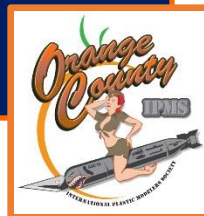

An Adventure through Owens Valley, Cerro Gordo, Laws, and the Everett Hill Ranch of CA

Part Three

The Laws Museum on US 6 is definitely a great stop for a few hours. You can really see the vision of the Virginia & Truckee RR concerning the Carson & Colorado Railway along the Owens Valley area. The C&CR did most of the work though to keep things going south of Mound House NV.



After Laws we returned to Bill Belt's home in Bishop and if you have not figured it out by now we are headed towards the ranch. Bill owns the old Everett Hill ranch and invited us out for the night. Saturday afternoon we headed out US 6. Made a right turn somewhere off 6 and headed towards the White Mountain range for several miles. The deal here is the road, washed out in some areas filled in by DWP

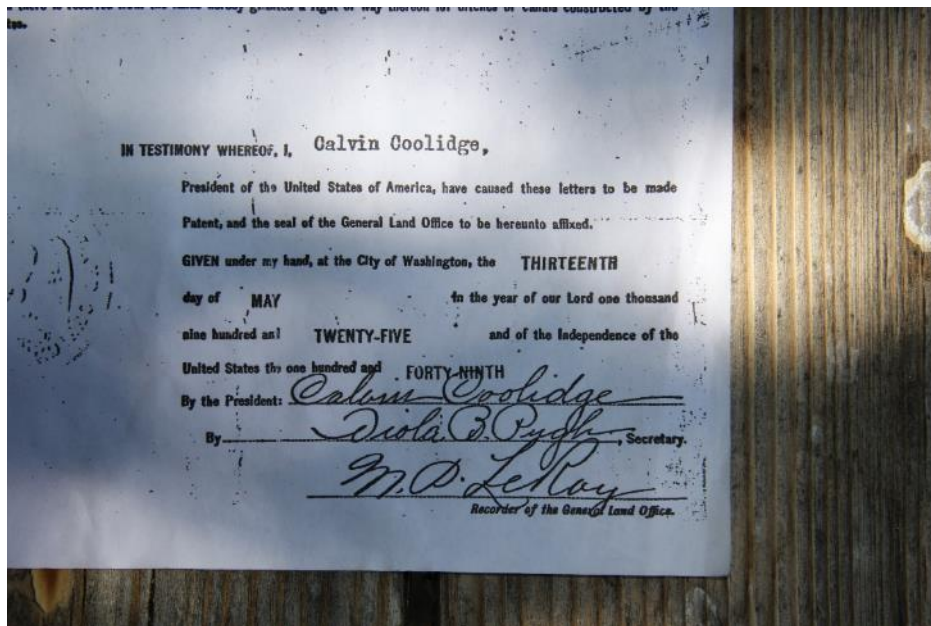
in others along a harsh washboard dirt road. The VW Diesel of Pascal commanded the road again with no problem. This is a smooth portion of that road in the photo.

This road is not even marked. As I have told some other folks, don't try to come up here as the Pumas will kill you first, then the heat, then finally, some lead.

Calvin Coolidge signed the Homestead notice for the property in May of 1925. We were sure that Coolidge probably signed many Homestead papers that day in '25, in what looks like Washington DC. I believe Bill picked up the property in the 1990's.



So what about a Homestead? Well I was always told that a Homestead meant you had to improve the property some way each year to insure your status is relevant and you keep the property.

Believe me Bill with the help of his friends and associates have improved the ranch 1,000% from the original photos Bill shared with me.

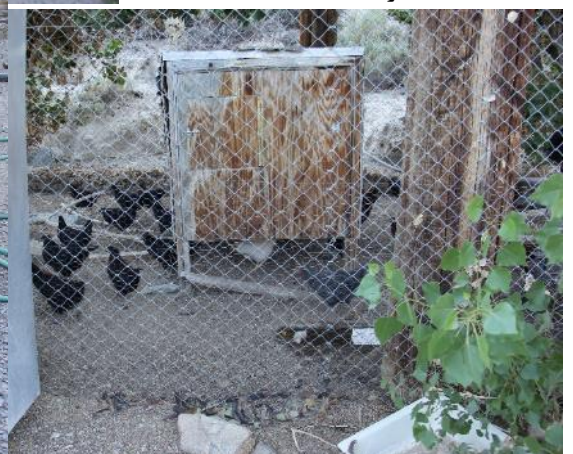
The property is fed by 4 natural springs that provide plenty of water and for irrigation as well along with several thousands of gallons of water storage. The irrigation system is built for efficiency and usage using the gravity fed method to feed the different areas that Bill's crew have established.

There are two chicken coups that have several hens and about 8-10 roosters. There is a brand new coup going up that will house about 100 or so hens and their roosters. Bill's associate, Terry is trying for FDA money as a certified egg producer and doing all of the construction to make it happen. Everything is solar power installed too.



As I walk up to the base of the foothills the hen house and rooster coup are to the left, along with a seed spreader (the black looking thing). Spins and throws the chicken feed out as far as you want.

This looked like the rooster end of the operation as I get to the top of the small rise. These guys are not afraid of much and you are in their territory, cock.

As Bill tells us, one afternoon a Mountain Lion, yes Cougar yes Puma all the same cat got into the hen house, killed a few chickens and then could not get out. Bill sniped the cougar and then called Fish and Wildlife to come pick her up. F&W and Bill discussed there may be a male around too. They setup a friendly trap, and sure enough a few nights later they trapped her mate. F&W came and picked up the cat. Bill asked where they would take him. F&W told him, not very far before letting him out in a close but remote area. In other words the cat would have trouble surviving in a completely strange place if he was taken far away to be let go. Maybe the cat will take to the new area and stay, then again maybe not.

I forgot to ask Bill what this strange shed was at the base of the foothill. Possible spring shed not in use yet.





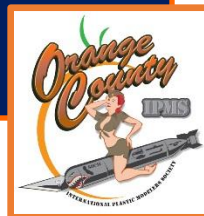

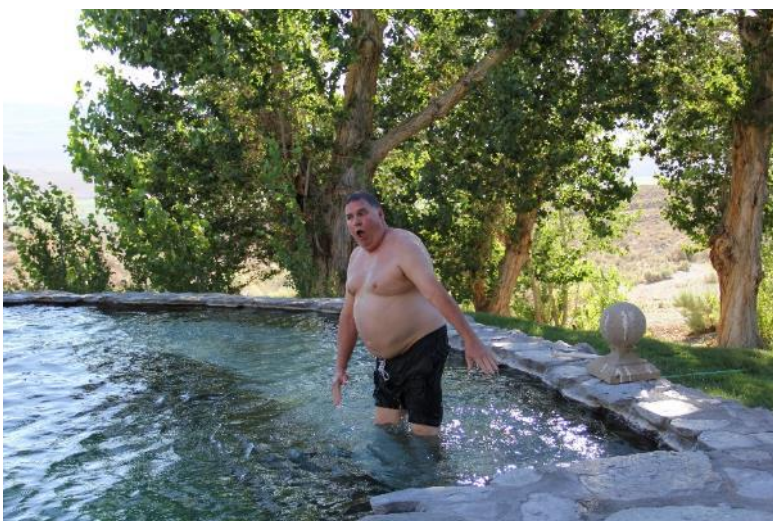

Cottonwood Charcoal Kilns

June 1873, a Colonel Sherman Stevens started two charcoal producing kilns on the western edge of Owens Lake, fed by his timber flume at Cottonwood Creek west of the location of the kilns up in the Sierras. Sherman's lumber was already being used for mines structures and large buildings. His kilns produced enough coal to be shipped across Owens Lake by the steamers Bessie Brady and then Mollie Stevens taking it across to Keeler. From there Remi Nadeau's animal teams would take it up to Cerro Gordo for the smelters. Here on the edge of the lake a high grade over a culvert, most likely a railroad spur towards the lake for loading.

About a mile or so off of 395 are the Colonel's kilns. The high grade above the kiln in the background and previous shot most likely brought in the timber either by flume or rail. The lumber would be stacked inside at ground level, and then from the upper door when the ground filled up. The doors were closed and off it torched. Later the charcoal was harvested out

of the front of the kiln. The shore was very close to these kilns, loading at Cartago on the western side of Owens Lake. Today, these engineering marvels are taking a toll in the sun. Efforts underway to protect them with a cover. The poles you see here will support that cover.

A photo from David Woodruff shows the kilns in what appears to be the mid-late 1940's, by the looks of the cars there. Still in pretty good shape back then from 80 years previous.

Of course today the chain-link fence and wire is up. Probably a good thing to keep the selfies from down inside the kiln. As we left 108 degrees F (42C). We headed home same way we came up, 395 to I-15 to the 91 and the OC.

Anyone ready to build some HO structures from scratch? I have several examples of sheet plastic from Evergreen and Plastruct I would like to show you.



Certainly, Bill's cabin at the ranch might be a good start, or the depot at Lone Pine. Next month, materials. **TH**

The subject that was being talked about was the F-14A from Tamiya in 48th scale as Mark and Terry already had the model. As they were discussing the build on the trip it got me motivated to partake, I have never liked the aircraft and had not purchased one until the Nationals as I was not going to build the plane no matter how well engineered the kit was.

I did pick up an F-14A from the Nationals, but not having any reference material I was able to procure the Squadron In Action F-14 book, which is okay. At the Nationals we did start working on Dave Fredericks to also do an F-14, of course he will need to light and motorize the model.

After returning from the Nationals where I had a great time, I went ahead and purchased the F-14D from Tamiya also a reference book recommend by Terry which was the DACO book on the F-14. It has a lot of excellent photos and I have already used it extensively.

Of course building aircraft is a bit of gluing plastic then painting, gluing plastic, then painting, rinse and repeat. So it's hard to complete in sequence. It looks good so far.

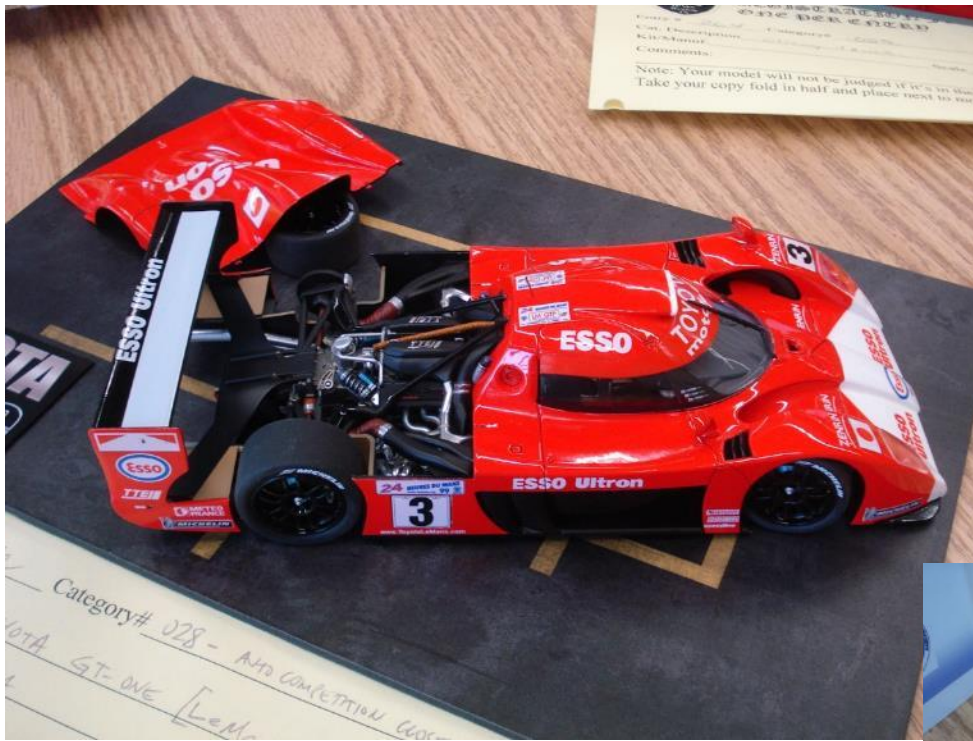
We did a quick sweep to see what categories we would enter to understand where the categories were before we brought in the kits. No on-line forms, everything filled in at the show.

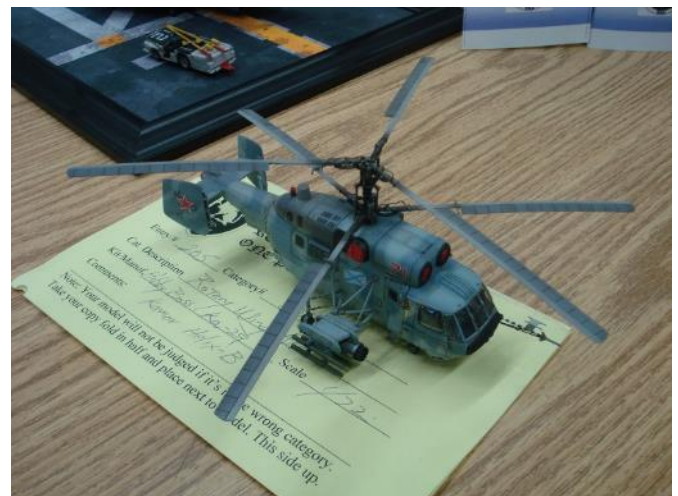
