



# Whats on my bench?

The kit went together pretty well with only minor wing root filling required. I have painted the spinner and applied the decal to give it the white swirl. The rest of the kit had had a primer of light grey undercoat





The next step is to take care of the rescribing and rivets and to preshade the panel lines. I always put rivets onto the model if it is ww2 era as I think it adds to the appearance and authenticity. You can find a lot of good info on rivet lines from this website www.airwar.ru It is a Russian website so be careful what you download but I have found it to be an excellent reference with many good drawings and photos of just about all ww2 aircraft.


Some of the tools I use to rescribe are shown below. I use a variety of rivet wheels to get the rivets marked and straight lines are marked using electrical tape—just to keep my hand steady





# Whats on my bench Continued

I usually airbrush the panel lines with flat black as I think the finish comes out better. I have seen shading done with a sharpie but I think the lines are too hard using this method—look at an active plane and you will note that the panel shading is not in straight lines.





Once the shading is done it is on with the paint. You can see the shading better in the picture of the underside and I have tried to show the rivet detail in the topside picture.



Next month will see the end of this project and also the end of this column as I will be starting on my 1/24 Mosquito which will be a long project. If nobody else can come up with a similar article as the last ones then I will assume that you do not want them in the Corsair

One of the things that are frequently seen on an airfield are aircraft jacks and maintenance saw horses. Until now the only thing that you could do if you wanted them in your diorama was scratch build them. Why someone has never thought to produce these accessories before is beyond

me. Thank goodness for Uschi van der Rosten thought this too and decided to do something about it.

Packaged in a thick cardboard box this standard set contains two sprues of plastic molded in light

grey plastic with no flash. Using the expertise of Peter Hamann in designing CAD, Uschi was able to put together a sprue that


includes one large jack, one smaller jack and one saw horse. The plastic is easy to work with and the parts breakdown is logical.

The instructions are on a single sheet of paper that is 'weathered' and easy to understand. They are written in German but the pictures are plenty to build the parts easily. There are no instructions for the saw horses but they are pretty self explanatory. There are no painting instructions. Painting comes down to

you. Uschi recommends RLM 02 for the jacks but a RAAL Dark Grey is also available and what ground equipment is painted in for the Luftwaffe.








### 1/48 Luftwaffe Jack Stands Sets with Saw Horses Continued.


Building the jacks is easy enough and can be done within a couple of hours. I only had to clean up the parts. You can adjust the height of the part by simply cutting it and adding part 2 to the top. You will have to scratchbuild the unique support assemblies for each type of aircraft. Uschi provides online assistance showing these, <u>https://www.uschivdr.com/das-werk/possible-easy-modifications/</u>

I think painting should be a dark grey typical of Boden vehicles, but you can do what you'd like. I used Tamiya German Grey. Then a wash of Black artist oils thinned with turpenoid. Chipping was added next then some Mig Pigments, Dry Mud and Wet Mud, were added to the base. Some Mig Pigments for Panzer Grey were added along the top of the parts to show fading. A silver drybrush was added to the twisted portion of the jack.

The saw horses were painted in a Tamiya Desert Yellow and burnt umber and burnt sienna artist oils were used to impart a grain pattern on the wood. This was sealed with Alclad Flat. Done. Simple and effective

I enjoyed building these. They were fun and look great. Weathering was easy enough. If you need a break from a complex project or need to add some things to your diorama this is the perfect for you. The diorama possibilities are really endless. The jacks are used for landing gear testing and for gun harmonization. There are some things that you may want to add that you'll have to scratch build. There are a number of suggestions on their website and plenty of references there as well. The jacks and saw horses were used on fighters, twin engine fighters, and jets like the Me-262 so you can get lots of use out of them. A great project from Uschi.

I wonder what else they can come up with?

**Registration**: We would like to have volunteers to help out with registration and give out the registration packages, T -shirts,etc. as required. These people don't have to be Arizona IPMS Chapter members. We will need 3-4 volunteers to actually register members these positions are only open to Arizona IPMS Chapter members. A little computer knowledge will be helpful here Their will be 2 or 3 training classes so everyone can become proficient with the process and we can test the systems.

Model Entry: We would like to have volunteers to assist entrants fill out the contest entry forms. With all the different categories and some new rule changes this can be quite confusing. We will have a short class to insure everyone is up to speed on the rules and categories. There are some positions that require some prior training and these will be handled by Arizona IPMS Chapter members.

Contest/Vendor Room Security: We would like to have volunteers to act as security for the contest and vendor rooms. This position requires checking tickets and wrist bands to allow guests access to these rooms. They will also patrol the contest room to remind visitors not to touch the models. 




