Model building Then and Now

Growing up I was a kid of the Late 1970's and 1980's Pop culture TV and Movies were a big part of that time period and heavily influenced my adolescent brain with movies such as Star Wars and Back to the Future to name a few.

Most of the kits I built growing up were your average AMT and Revell offerings. They were mostly snap kits with a low parts count and the fit was less than optimal. BUT THEY WERE GREAT!!! Of course my favorites were the vehicles from my childhood, The Old AMT Starship Enterprise (also the best selling and longest produced injection model kit of all time) or that classic orange plastic General Lee, and of course everything Star Wars related.

Research was scarce growing up before the internet, before Wikipedia and Google we were limited to a few seconds of reference material from a fuzzy paused VCR image on a old analog tv screen. If your family was lucky enough to own one. I even joined a Knight Rider fan club to receive a 8 x 10 color photo of my favorite talking car, only to receive a 8 x 10 Black and White of David Hasselhoff leaning on a poorly built replica. Ugh you guys have it soooo easy now. Too bad the new generation spends most of this amazing resource on cat videos and facebook.

Once we finally obtained all of our research from the card catalog at our local library we were ready to build!

Now get this guys and girls,

NO PHOTO ETCH, NO RESIGN, NO CUSTOM DECALS, NO LIGHT KITS, NO CONVERSION SETS. For the most part these things just didn't exist yet or were very rare, very expensive and you had to know where to find it if there were any left. For the most part if we chose to detail our models, we were limited to those old classic square bottles of Testors paint and that tube of orange glue. In my experience that was pretty much it.

So you can imagine my disdain when I hear young people on social media complain about building models today, how the hobby is dying or that they don't make a lighting kit or detail part for such and such model. Yes there is still room for improvement but before complaining think about these 5 things and how you would build if you didn't have them.

1. There are more model manufacturers now than ever before. (Polystyrene alone has over 120 companies as of 2019)
2. Quality of new kits both foreign and domestic has for the most part improved greatly. (see photos below)
3. More aftermarket parts and decals are available than ever before.
4. More companies are making Paint, tools and glues than ever before.
5. INTERNET RESEARCH AND PURCHASING!!! YouTube for Kit Reviews and How to.

Yes just like my father before me, I am now that old curmudgeon complaining about how these kids have it so easy

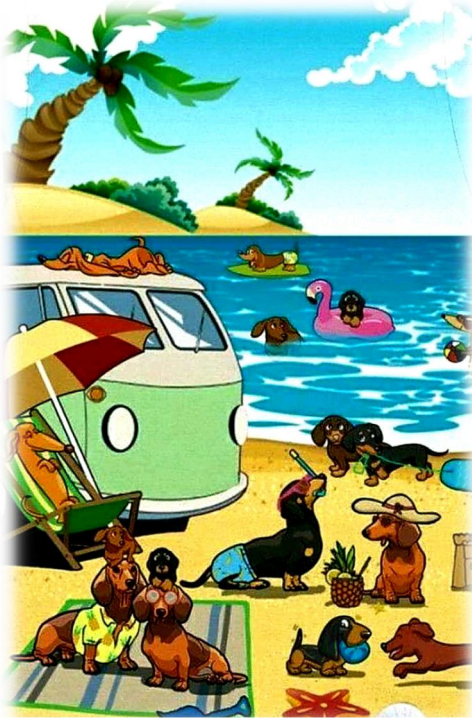
